John F. Kennedy
Born: May 29, 1917 in Massachusetts Died: November 22, 1963 in Texas
John was raised in a wealthy and powerful political family. He had three brothers.

James Monroe
Born: April 28, 1758 in Virginia Died: July 4, 1831 in New York

James was raised in the Virginia colony, when the American colonies and their British rulers were building tension. James' father was a farmer and a carpenter. He passed away when James was sixteen years old, which left James to take over his father's land and care for his four younger brothers and sisters. James was able to enroll in the College of William and Mary, but didn't finish his education because of the Revolutionary War. He joined the local Virginia Militia and then the Continental Army, held the rank of Major, and fought under the control of George Washington. James was shot in the shoulder at the Battle of Trenton, but recovered at Valley Forge. Once James left the army as a dedicated war hero, he decided to become a lawyer. He worked for Thomas Jefferson's law practice, became a member of the Virginia legislature and the Continental Congress. After the United States was formed as a new country, James became a member of the U.S. Congress and then became the Governor of Virginia. He also gained experience by working for presidents. He went to France for Thomas Jefferson to help with the Louisiana Purchase and served as Secretary of State and Secretary

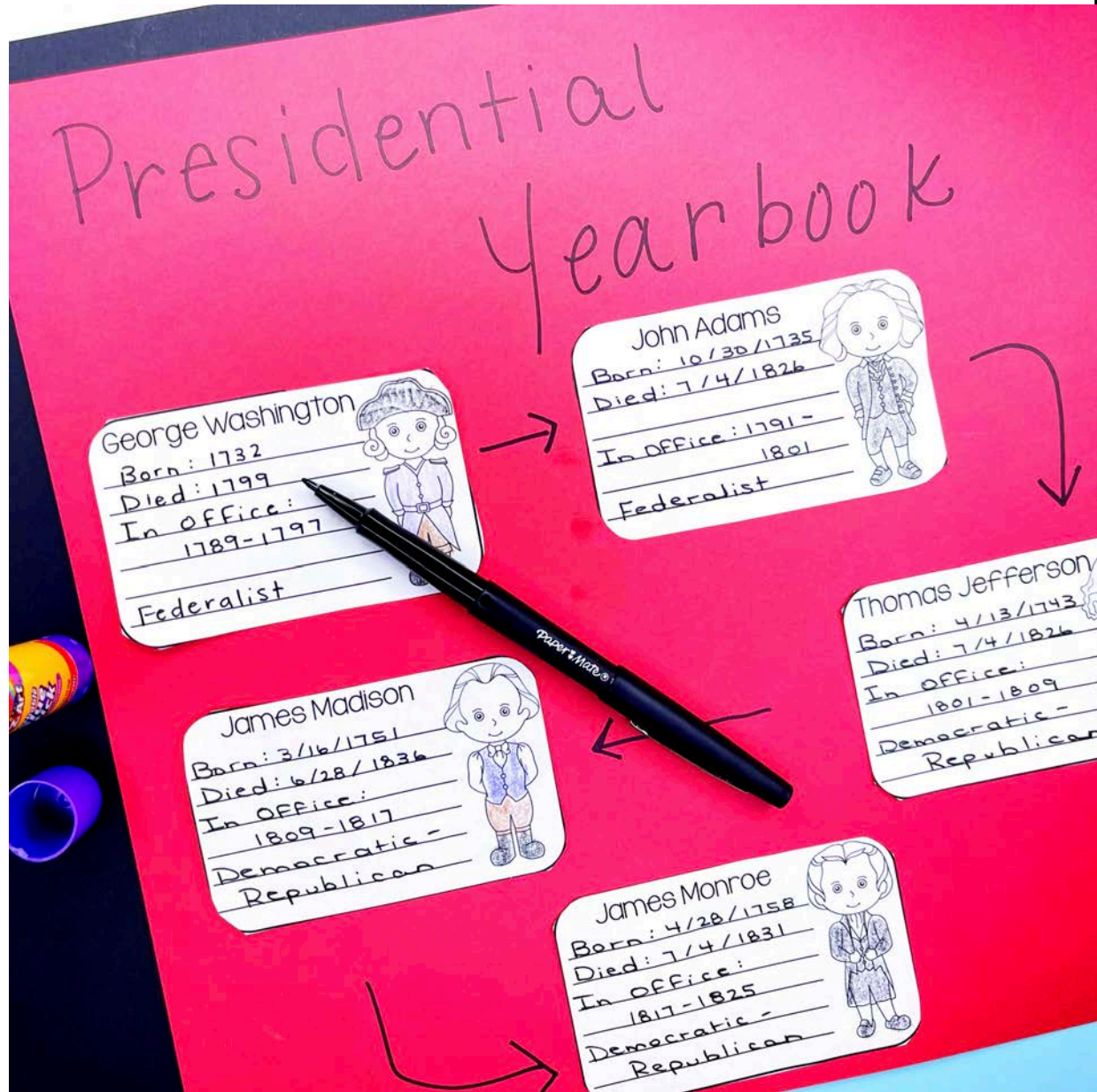


CREATE A PRESIDENT TIMELINE

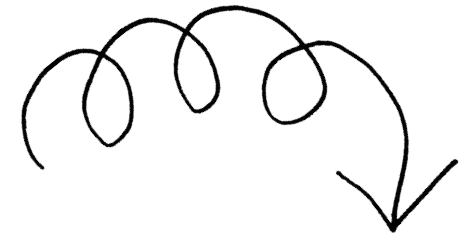
