AMELIA EARHART

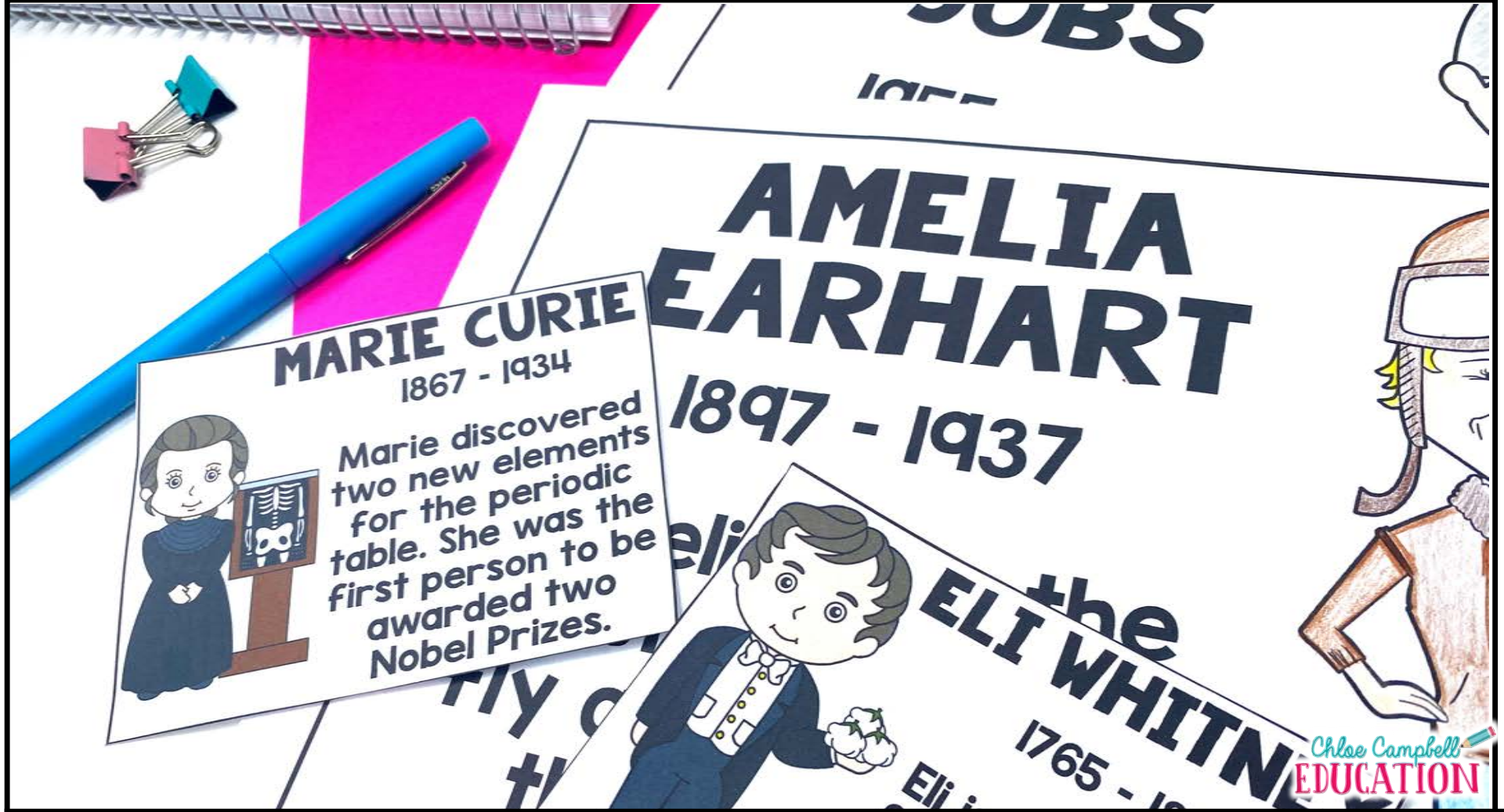
1897 - 1937

MARIE CURIE
1867 - 1934
