Steps to Create a Photo Booth:

- Decide where your photo booth will be set up: In your classroom, a hallway, a door, the library, etc.
- Decide on the background for your photo booth: a wall of balloons, a whiteboard, a tablecloth hanging on the wall, streamers, a bulletin board, etc.
- Will you use additional props like sunglasses, hats, or lay out construction paper for students to create their own?
- Will you have a dedicated camera at the photo booth, will you use a tripod, or can you be near the camera to take the picture each time?
- Don't be afraid to jump into photos with students and parents! Have fun with the photo booth and show your energy.
- Send photos to parent emails, post on school website (with permission), and add the pictures to your school yearbook!
