

## CREATE A GHOST BALLOON

### Materials:

- White balloon
- Black sharpie
- Empty water bottle
- Vinegar
- Baking Soda

### Procedure:

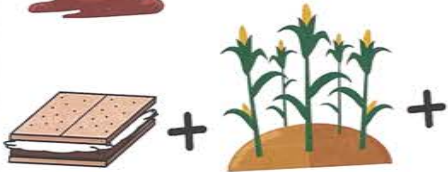
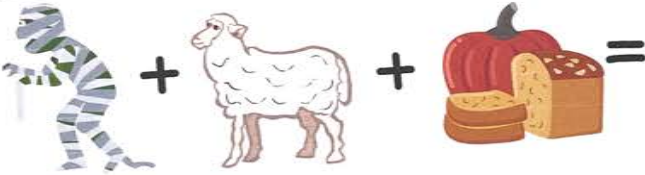
1. Draw eyes on the white balloon using the black sharpie.
  2. Add 2 tablespoons of baking soda to the balloon.
  3. Add 1 cup of vinegar to the empty water bottle.
- Secure the balloon on top of the water bottle, but be sure to not let any of the vinegar fall out of the balloon yet. Shake the balloon, shaking out the vinegar in the bottom of the bottle. Keep the balloon inflated enough.
